SSRC Has a Group Email! Have You Signed UP?

We have established a "group email" for the club on the Groups io platform. You may already have an account with Groups io as many of the hardware and software companies we use in this hobby have a group.

Unlike real-time (synchronous) chats or instant messaging, email group members are not forced to be online all at the same time. The asynchronous nature of email has several advantages, especially for larger, distributed groups. Basically, you sign up and subscribe to the groups that interest you. When you become a member of the group, any email you send to the group goes to everyone in the group, as do responses. Our group is: K4GSO

Just type <u>groups.io</u> in your search bar and follow the link to the site. Sign up if you don't have an account and search for our group: K4GSO. You will see our group: K4GSO / Silver Springs Radio Club. Click on the button: Apply for membership in this group. You're now a member.

We will use the group to mentor, send info on upcoming events, list equipment for sale or find parts for projects, and post reviews of equipment or recaps of POTA activations.

Welcome to the home of the Marion County Traffic Net. The

MCTN is the local affiliate of and is sponsored by the American Radio Relay League's National Traffic System, which provides an organized method for moving messages related to the event. Called traffic, these messages can provide information critical for saving lives or property, as well as inquiring about the health or welfare of those affected into and out of our area.

Traffic is relayed from one location to another. When areas are hit by large-scale events, such as hurricanes, earthquakes, landslides, or technology failures that impact electricity or communications, amateur radio operators can set up equipment in the affected area to restore communications.

This is the primary function of the MCTN to practice handling formal Radiogram message traffic as part of the NTS. We encourage you to visit the NTS website for training materials and other resources as well as the other useful links below. <u>http://www.arrl.org/NTS</u>

I had to make a special delivery there one day, and surprise, I got the grand tour. I met the staff & toured the new facilities which are conveniently located directly across the street from First Christian Church.

While embarking on the tour, I got to meet Hunter, Parker, and another YL whose name totally escapes me. I got to see the new studios, the tower, production areas and, of course spend time with Hunter.

We go way back to when we had our store on South Pine Ave in Ocala. I had won a pair of Eagles tickets for a show in Orlando back in 2013. So after reminiscing about the concert, some old times and things like that, she showed me a video of the old 300' tower coming down and some more chit-chat.

She'll be at the Outdoor Expo on August 12 at the World Equestrian Center, along with other people from WIND & K-Country.

When they moved in, they got all new equipment, all digital, touchscreen, and a really nice and well designed, modern studio. The sound board appeared to be either 16 or 24 channels. I didn't dive into it too much, but I was truly impressed.

In the conference room on the way out, there was, of all things, a Heil Gold Line on a tripod sitting there and I pointed it out. I think I impressed them with my knowledge of the equipment of theirs. I had to stop and take a picture of this just because it hits home to every ham's dream, to have an awesome studio mic and headset that's as aesthetically pleasing to look at as it is delightful to listen to.

RF Ground Panel

You may remember when I spoke about Lightning and grounding systems that I mentioned "RF Ground Panels". A ground panel goes under your radio gear to hopefully reduce stray pick up from indoor radio equipment and interconnecting cables, and curtails voltage differences between your equipment.

These panels are available from DX Engineering and range in price from \$209 for copper down to \$69.00 for Aluminum.

Being a HAM, I decided to make my own from steel. While walking Thor (my constant four-legged companion) down Ft. King St. one morning I noticed a fairly large black panel laying in the grass. It was the side panel from a Dell desk-top computer. So, I brought it home and the wheels started turning as I walked back to the house, what can I do with this? **Hmmm a Ground Plate!**

I cut the panel down to size with a saber saw to fit my radio, drilled 2- ¼ holes, added a couple of ¼ inch bolts with star washers and nuts for ground mounting posts, added some rubber feet so there is no movement or scratches on the table, made up some connecting wires to connect the tuner and radio to the Ground Panel. Then I made a cable to get the panel connected to the only ground I have in my interior ham shack, the 3rd wire ground through the house wiring.

If you recall my shack is in a small Walkin closet which is on an inside wall, with concrete floors. So, my only access to ground is through the house wiring. Considering that my 4 earth ground rods, antenna masts, the Polyphasers and antennas are all connected to each other and then to the house GREEN ground this is not that bad. It for sure isn't the closest connection to earth, but it is still GROUND!

I had an old power cord which I modified to make a ground connection through the power distribution box. I cut off the white and black wires, covered them with shrink sleeving then connected a wire to the green ground lead of the plug and then heat shrink sleeve over that.

Again, the best lightning protection is ARRL insurance. I did talk to ARRL insurance provider and had I put the printer on the policy it would have been covered. She told me that anything that is involved with HAM radio could be on the policy. So, if your computer is connected to the web wirelessly via a modem than could probably be covered if listed on your policy!

Even if you never played the (1980's) game you probably heard of it in one of its various forms, video or TV game show.

It seems some surveys show that Americans do poorly in geography when asked to locate or name states or countries on a blank map. This caused me to wonder if WAS, DXCC or other certificate chasing Amateur Radio Operators were better than the average public. (Note: ARRL DXCC is 340 *entities*)

WSPR(*Weak Signal Propagation Reporter*) is one of the programs that will show states and countries where your signal is being heard, places that might surprise you. Previous newsletters have articles about its results and benefits.

When I looked at one of my results I quickly realized I could name 5 of the continents (7 each) but countries, (195 each) I would not even try. So that left the US states to try. I scored 80%. Those pesky North Midwest and North Upper East states, places I've never traveled caught me off guard. Don't be ashamed, most of us have been out of school for a while. And geography is no longer taught in many school systems.

But before you start congratulating yourself try the 5 Main US |Territories, the 13 Colonies, or State Capitols. OK, an easy one for native Floridians, surely you know all the Florida counties.

Then print your own certificate (maybe the club president and secretary will sign it).


