It's a beautiful time to be outside and we experienced delightful weather over the weekend that saw the Florida parks on the air event unfold. I'm anxious to hear everyone's experiences

We are excited to have R T Systems Software representatives offer their thoughts and product information as our April presenters. This month's main presentation, as was last months, will be via ZOOM and that link will be shared on the website and via groups IO for those who cannot attend, so that they may also benefit from the informational offering.

I am also glad to report that Operation. Highwire, the Perry Field antenna project, has been successfully completed and tested. Both the East and West rhombics are up and running properly. The tri-band Yagi, located atop the 100 foot tower, saw adjustments that brought it to full operating potential as well. City of Ocala crews arrived Friday and installed new coax (Messi & Paoloni Ultraflex 7) from Balun to building at the West rhombic pole, giving the system a low loss feed line that should last for years to come. Along with me on site to assist in the installation and testing were Terry Strey KN4FMH, Mike Romanovich KQ4CCH and Hayden Kaufman N4HAY. We are grateful for their time and effort completing this project.

Our next endeavor, "Operation Field-strip" will involve some muscle and manpower. In an effort to make Perry Field an attractive, safe location for ALL SSRC members to enjoy, I'd like to ask any willing to pitch in an hour or two on a dedicated weekend in the near future, to assist in the loading of a dozen tower sections, a few coils of guy wire and some old scrap lumber, onto a flatbed trailer. The tower sections will be cleaned and stored off-site in preparation for sale at the June 1st tailgate. The remainder will be disposed of safely. Once the area is free of clutter, the site will be easier to mow and maintain as well as add an aesthetic attraction that's been absent for some years. We hope to make Perry Field a place for any and all club members to enjoy. Perhaps a celebratory cook out is in order.....?

As always, we look forward to next week's general meeting with anticipation of good fellowship and another great presentation. See you soon.

Inovato Quadra - HamClock

The Inovato Quadra is a tiny computer that runs the HamClock software on your monitor or TV. It displays a world map with day/night shading, DX spots, sunspot numbers, clock, and numerous other items of ham radio interest. The Quadra measures about 4" x 4" x 3/4". If you order the bundle for \$59 plus shipping (https://inovato.com), you get everything you need to run the HamClock – Quadra, stand, cooling fan, wireless mini keyboard with touchpad, 4-port USB hub, HDMI cable, USB wall wart, and USB power cable. The Quadra has built-in wifi, so you don't need the optional Bluetooth/wifi dongle. If you use your own USB keyboard and mouse, you can save \$10 by eliminating the mini keyboard. Your monitor or TV should display 1080p or higher resolution.

The built-in setup routine is quick and easy, but from there on you will need to watch a lot of YouTube videos to gain full advantage of all the features. It's not a Geochron, but it's pretty neat!



Ham radio operators hold disaster exercise

The message "CQ-field day," which is ham radio code for "calling any station, requesting a response," filled the air as Silver Springs Radio Club members gathered for a 24-hour national disaster preparedness exercise hosted by the American Radio Relay League.

The event was held Saturday and Sunday at the McPherson Governmental Complex.

Amateur, or "ham," radio operators can become the only line of communication during emergencies, when other means are not operable due to damage or lack of power.

EMERGENCY: Operators established contact and logged calls at event.

During last weekend's field exercise, the opera-tors established contact tors established contact and logged calls, repre-senting a possible future lifesaving link in time of disaster. More than 800 contacts were made this year, as compared to about 500 last year. We are infrastructure

free, as opposed to methods of communica-tion that require wires and fixed towers, said club vice president Joe Bilancio, 64, ah amateur radio buff since age 16. "We have five stations set up for 24 hours, making as many contacts as possible," Bilancio said as he led a tour of Green Clover Hall. "We have a 100-foot tower permanently installed near the hall."

The club, which has about 100 members and is in its 63rd year, meets at the hall each month. K4GSO is the call sign for the ham radio station maintained by the club. According to club

member Tony Blalock, "in any emergency, ham rad operators are there first with vital links to help. "In the flood in Ocala

about 30 years ago, hams helped, and in the 2004 hurricanes," he said. During the Vietnam War and Desert Storm, ham radio communication patched local families into conversations with loved ones in the service, he
